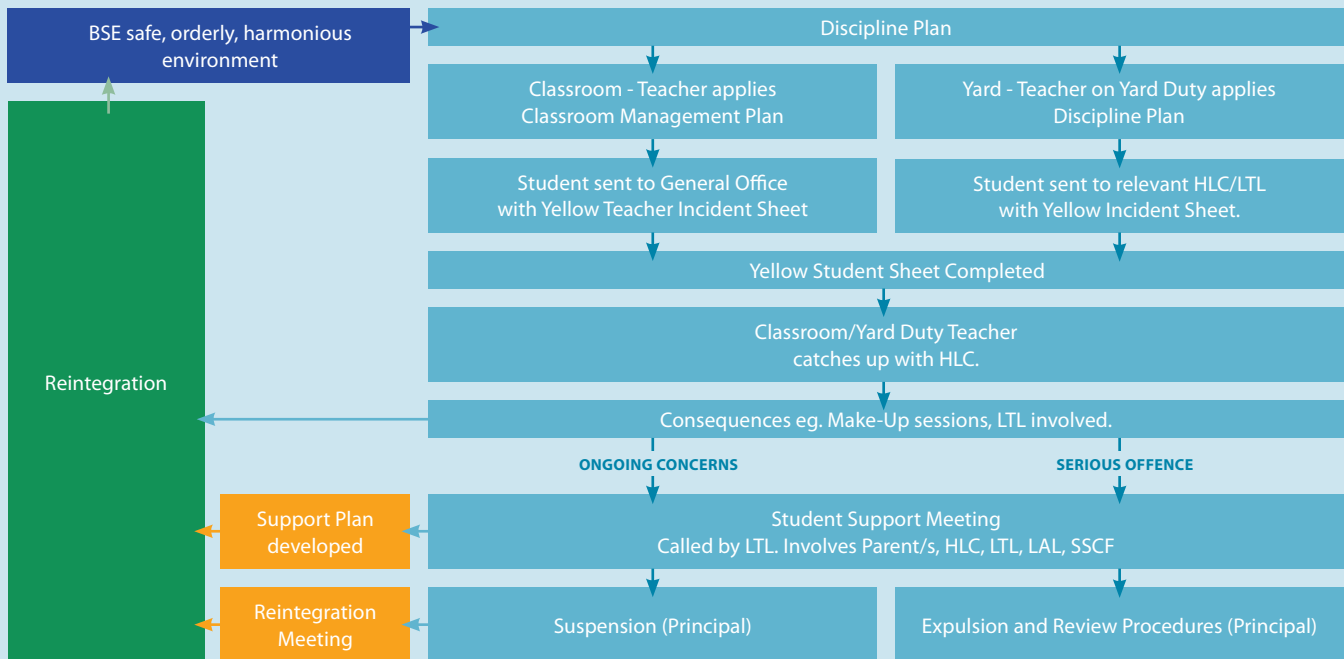
We understand we have rights and responsibilities.
